Whisper quiet (from only 58dB), they dry hands in as little as 9 seconds, a third the time of conventional hot air dryers, thereby reinforcing the essential parameters of Panoramic 34. Mitsubishi Electric Jet Towel does not blast vast quantities of hot air over the users' hands as traditional dryers do. Instead, the hands are inserted into a generously proportioned drying chamber, where precision designed nozzles direct a high-speed laminar flow of air over the hands to remove moisture as droplets, which are directed straight into an integral drain, so minimising hygiene risks.

Venue owners and managers are always delighted to discover that Mitsubishi Electric Jet Towel's running costs are very low. The power required for each drying operation is only a fraction to that of hot air dryers. Maintenance and service are low, especially compared to paper towel alternatives, which require regular attention from a member of staff.

It is a whole new experience that brings pleasure to the simple act of hand drying.
